#### **Significant Events and/or Alarms**

- On August 9, the vendor who was solicited to perform the MI-OSHA required Building Asbestos Survey was on site and provided a written report of their recent survey. This report was forwarded to the Board Members via e-mail. In short summary, the survey has revealed "Asbestos Containing Materials" (ACM) are present in the building, and some other Presumed Asbestos Containing Material(PACM). This survey is one of the elements required by the recent MI-OSHA inspection. In addition to this survey, there is a requirement to produce and have available for employees and vendors to view an "Asbestos awareness and management plan". The Fire Chief has obtained input on this plan from Fire Committee Member Jeff Mather, owner of Access Safety. This meeting was requested to help the FD formulate this management plan as Mr. Mather has experience in this arena. The goal is to have a management plan completed by October 1, 2017. Other requirements of the management plan include the education/training of employees responsible for cleaning and maintaining buildings with known or suspected asbestos containing materials. I am pleased to report that the "Target Solutions" training software recently purchased, provides a certified program to meet this requirement that has been assigned and completed by Deputy Chief Paige.
- The signed contract for the new Tender/Pumper has been delivered to the vendor. B & B truck
  is working on the drawing with poly tank/body vendor and the engineer for a final approval
  stamp of the build specifications.
- On August 20, 2017 @ 1257 hours, SFD responded to a two vehicle crash in the 800 block of M-46. Mutual aid was requested for Algoma FD to assist. This incident was the first opportunity to utilize the new Genesis hydraulic rescue tools recently purchased. The team was extremely pleased with their performance and the patient was rapidly cut free from the vehicle. Most

- noteworthy comments about operating the tools was the "umbilical free" freedom as the operator needed to crawl around the vehicle.
- No news is good news as FireHouse Subs is still considering the grant request for the purchase of the ACCD. All funds raised for this purchase have been transferred from the Fire Association to the Township Treasurer. Access Safety made a generous contribution to the fund this month.
- The former Pierson Township FD made a donation of old fire gear, hoses, and equipment to SFD.
- Captain Gabrielse provided full time coverage for 2 hours on August 3.
- Four personnel who were unavailable in July completed their annual NFPA exams at other sites this month.
- One new hire has been requested for Board consideration at the 9-12-17 meeting. In addition, a
  late request to consider an additional applicant will be submitted on 9-11-17. If approved, both
  candidates are interested in providing both EMS and Fire duties. The current plan is to enroll
  both in a MFR course starting in October in Oakfield Township and then enroll in the MFFTC fire
  academy at Plainfield FD in October 2018. Great news.
