- One of the monthly meetings that I often try to attend is the Kent County Fire Commission (KCFC) Board Meeting at the Kent County Road Commission Chamber Room on Scribner in Grand Rapids. Solon Township is one of 21 agencies that comprise the KCFC. The KCFC benefits include:
 - o Property and liability insurance for all of the member agency's FD vehicles
 - o Repairs and Preventive Maintenance of all KCFC owned vehicles
 - Rotational deposit of funds dedicated to purchase new apparatus for each agency on a 18 year rotation
 - o Member agency provided first opportunity to purchase apparatus being replaced
 - o Access to Kent County Purchasing Division
 - Group purchasing
 - Reverse auctions
 - Request for Proposal
 - Access is provided to any government agency or department

Recently, the KCFC Board conducted an audit of the vehicle insurance valuation process. In part due to the recent addition of a new member and the need to provide coverage for a relatively larger fleet. Also, due to a recent vehicle accident requiring replacement of said vehicle. During the process of evaluation, much discussion occurred about the "replacement" value being used by the insurance carrier. It was determined the current coverage provided "like replacement" of said vehicle and this raised much concern with the Chief's present at the meeting from the FD agencies. In the end, the mutual concern of providing adequate insurance coverage while balancing the cost resulted in an extensive review of the vehicle insurance program. This review resulted in the change outlined in the policy letter below. Great news for the end users and the KCFC budget.

Dear Member,

The Kent County Fire Commission Board at their March 11, 2016 meeting authorized to purchase the Fire Commission fleet insurance policy from the Michigan Municipal League (MML) effective April 1, 2016. The purpose of this letter is to inform members regarding this transition and to request important information.

The Fire Commission insurance policy has been with insurance broker BHS and underwriter, the Par Plan for a number of years. The current premium paid for insurance is \$238,383. MML's quote is \$174,686. MML's quote is \$63,697 less on an annual basis than the existing policy premium and \$107,690 less than the Par Plan's quote for the enhanced coverage being offered by MML.

MML's policy will provide for the replacement of destroyed equipment with new equipment (e.g. replace a 2005 pumper with a 2016 pumper) as opposed to 'like kind and quality' which would replace a 2005 pumper with a 2005 pumper. In addition, MML's policy provides a broader scope of coverage and has a local office and claims center.

The MML policy is based on stated values. It is important that members value their vehicle at 2016 new vehicle pricing. Attached is a list of your vehicles covered under the new MML policy and their stated value. If you require a change to the stated value on the vehicle schedule, please send the changes to Stephanie Lee, Kent County Risk Manager, <u>by March 25, 2016</u>. The attached values will be used if no response is received by the deadline. Responses may be sent by email to <u>stephanie.lee@kentcountymi.gov</u> or by fax to (616) 632-7665.

Questions about this process or any insurance-related issues or claims throughout the year may be directed to Stephanie. Stephanie's phone number is (616) 632-7667. We can also recommend a third party appraisal service upon request if you wish to seek assistance in establishing the stated value.

The Board meets monthly at 8:30 a.m. at the Kent County Road Commission on the second Friday of each month except for July, October and November. Member departments are encouraged to attend these meetings and offer input or suggestions.

- I received one application for the posted Deputy Chief position that expired on March 7, 2016. Upon reviewing the personnel file of the candidate, it was determined that a certificate is missing. The candidate was given until early May to obtain the Michigan Fire Fighters Training Council (MFFTC) Fire Fighter II certificate that is missing and is a required element for the position. It should be noted that this candidate has obtained other advanced certificates that require the missing certificate as a prerequisite, yet it now seems to be missing.
- On March 5, 2016 SFD responded to a snowmobile crash on Trenton north of 21 Mile Road. This crash scene had two patients that were transported with non-life threatening injuries. Mutual aid was requested from Sand Lake FD.
- On March 20, 2016 SFD assisted Kent City FD on a garage fire at 17800 Red Pine with Engine 1, Tender 1 and ten personnel.
- On March 23, 2016 SFD responded to a possible kitchen fire with the complainant trapped inside the structure at 17295 Simmons in her wheelchair. Automatic aid partners included the Sand Lake, Kent City, and Algoma Fire Departments. While en route, units were advised that the occupant was able to escape the structure and she was in the yard. Sand Lake FD Engine 6 was the first unit on scene and they reported heavy smoke from the rear of the house. Solon Engine 1 arrived next and members formed a crew to make an interior attack. Within a few minutes it was determined that the fire had spread to the attic and additional man power aid was requested from Cedar Springs FD. Eventually the fire was extinguished but not before substantial loss of the roof on the rear side and heavy smoke and water damage. The structure presented some unique challenges with its very shallow pitched roofs, multiple additions, tons of personal storage, and century old age. In the end, there were no civilian or fire service injuries and everyone went home.
- On March 24, 2016 SFD returned to the above address as the fire was burning again in the attic area not far from the point of origin of the original fire. Auto and mutual aid was requested from Sand Lake, Kent City, Algoma, and Cedar Springs FD.
