#### **Departmental Activities**

- **Assessing:** The 2026 Assessment roll is complete. Assessment change notices will be going out later this month.
- **Building:** Down slightly from last month.
- **Zoning:** no update.

- **Fire Department:** Had 58 calls in January. Received mutual aid three times and gave aid seven times.

- **Outside Assembly Ordinance:** A motion was made by Ellick to amend the Outdoor Assembly Ordinance to reduce the number of people to not exceed 50, seconded by Anielski.
